Important Information

TRAFFIC REGULATIONS FOR SCHOOL COMPOUND

These regulations are designed for the safety of your children. Please show respect for them. In so doing you protect your child and also teach them to respect regulations.

Please consider the safety of our children and that of others as well. Set good examples and teach our children the importance of respecting rules and regulations, including the traffic directives presently in place at the School.

- Use caution and drive **SLOWLY**, at all times.
- Driving onto the school compound Please DO NOT STOP to drop off children by the entrance / exit to the Staff car park or at the main gate by the gardens. This causes:
 - o traffic to back-up (especially when children have to collect belongings from the trunk and receive hugs and kisses outside the vehicle)
 - o frustration for and impatience to other drivers who usually follow the rules and park in the car park
 - o delays to persons who wish to exit via the front gate.
- Traffic should TURN TO THE RIGHT AFTER ENTERING THE LOWER CAR PARK and not proceed straight over the crosswalk.
- In "main" car park area, please follow directional signs.
- Mornings only exit back gate or front gate.
- Evenings exit back gate ONLY from 2:15 3:45 p.m., 4:00 4:30 p.m.
- DO NOT drop off children at the Barrier to the Staff Car Park.
- <u>DO NOT</u> allow your child (children) to run through the carpark when being collected or dropped off. Please encourage them to use the path from the blue benches to walk to their respective classes.
- <u>DO NOT</u> block the driveway.
- In order to allow for 2-way traffic there should be NO PARKING ALONG THE SIDE OF THE DRIVE.
- There should be NO PARKING IN THE DROP-OFF AND COLLECTION BAY as this causes long lines, obstruction and impatience. This combination increases the dangers for children. Cones will be placed there to prohibit parking during Collection time
- Please respect the parking area designated for STAFF ONLY.
- We urge you to follow the instructions of the Security Guard.

TRAFFIC, PARKING

Please remember to also exercise due care and caution when driving, particularly in the built up areas around our School - Henry's Lane, Dunlow Lane and surrounding districts. Look out for pedestrians – especially small children. Kindly send a positive message to our children about being considerate of others.

- Do not block access to the homes or businesses outside the entrance / driveway of the School including the Spencer Thorne Engineering Office and the homes in that location (right of our entrance / exit).
- DO NOT PARK IN FRONT OF, ON THE PROPERTY OF OR IN THE CORNER NEAR, NOR BLOCK AND HINDER ACCESS TO AND FROM the Joan Arundell Nursery (left of our back exit gate). Parking is available on the hardcourt to the east of the Nursery and a few spaces are available on the right side behind our wall outside the back gate.

Be considerate. Please do not inconvenience, hinder or put at risk any of the nursery students, parents or employees. St. Gabriel's School will not be responsible for any action taken by the Joan Arundell Nursery against persons who will not adhere to their requests. Thank you.

• IDLING VEHICLES in the school car park - We are asking parents to show consideration and SWITCH OFF ALL ENGINES WHILE WAITING IN THE ST. GABRIEL'S CAR PARK.

EARLY / LATE ARRIVAL –

- ➤ Children who are brought to school **before 7:30 a.m.**, when supervision begins, must **NOT** be left unsupervised. This applies especially to the young ones in the Infants and Nursery. The School cannot be held liable for any occurrence/event which takes place before 7:30 a.m.
- All Juniors who arrive at school after 8:30 a.m. are required to sign the Late Book in the Office before going to class. Attending school regularly and being on time are skills for life. A punctual start to the day benefits all students. Kindly make every effort to minimize non-essential absences and lateness to and from School.
- SCHOOL FEES <u>must be paid by Friday 14th September 2018</u>. Thank you. Fees can be paid online at the CIBC First Caribbean International Bank. You may also pay by cash, Credit/Debit card or cheque at the School's Admin office.
- CONTACT INFORMATION please supply correct and/or additional details Kindly inform the Office immediately of any change in contact details telephone numbers, home or email address etc. When children are ill or need to leave school urgently or unexpectedly we need to contact you. We have experienced incidences where parents CANNOT BE REACHED, or REPEATED TELEPHONE CALLS have had to be made.

If you have changed/added additional telephone numbers or changed your address, please URGENTLY contact the Office to update your child's contact information and supply additional emergency details where necessary. Thank you.

Using Social Media for Good

The School's **Code of Conduct** states that social media should not be used to air grievances, complaints, stir up the parent body, incite actions against the School or its Management/administration. I wish to gently caution parents against this type of conduct. Please check your copy of the **Code of Conduct** for more detailed information and please use social media for positive and productive purposes.

Incidents / Accidents – contacting parents

If your child suffers a serious accident or an injury to the head whilst at School, we will call and let you know immediately. All other minor scrapes and cuts will be dealt with and you will be informed at the end of the day, or if your child attends an after-school activity, the next day..

SECURITY / SAFETY

Parents are reminded of the importance of observing and requiring their children to observe all safety and security measures presently in place at the School. These include:

- ✓ **Notification** contact the School if there is a change in the collection arrangement.
- ✓ Collection of children This should be done directly from the collection areas by the parent/guardian. This helps us to identify who has collected the child. The child should indicate to the member of staff on duty that he/she is leaving.
 - Infant parents must wait by the blue benches until the bell rings before proceeding to collect children from the classroom.
 - Junior parents please also wait by the blue benches until the children are brought down to the collection area by the Class Teacher.
- ✓ **Collection area** Children must not return to the classroom or bathroom without permission from a member of staff.
- ✓ **After School Activities** Children must go to the After School supervision area and not the car park or elsewhere after ALL extra-curricular activities, unless the tutor/coach is still supervising.
- ✓ **Staff** The directives given by the security personnel, grounds persons and other members of staff should be followed. These instructions and advice are always given in the best interests of the children.
- ✓ Entry to compound during school hours close the front gate on entry and exit, if it is unattended. If the gate is locked, call the telephone number on the sign to gain entry.
- ✓ Visits Please be reminded that you <u>must check with the Office before proceeding to your child's class</u>. We have a 'signing in book' and ask that you enter the details requested i.e. date, time, name, purpose of visit. We also ask that you allow the teachers to give priority to the children once the school day has started. If you need to pass on some important information to the class teacher perhaps a note may be left at the Office. Please avoid any disruption to the school day and valuable teaching time.
 - **ABSENCE FROM SCHOOL**: prior notice of planned absences, stating clearly the reason for the absence, should be given in writing by letter or Permission Absence Form, (obtainable from the School office).
 - A note, clearly stating the nature of the illness, should be sent upon the child's return to School after any such absence. A Doctor's certificate of clearance is required, following absence for an infectious disease.
- TRAVELLING ABROAD DURING SCHOOL TIME If your child or children are travelling abroad during School time, please complete a Certificate of Exemption Form as well as the School's Permission Slip for each child. The Certificate of Exemption form is a requirement from the Ministry of Education and is for your own protection as you enter various regional or international territories with your school-age child (children). Both forms are available from the Office.

Leaving the school compound

• Parents are reminded to kindly exit the compound when the bell rings at 8:30 a.m. It is distracting when parents congregate in the Car park and by the Blue Benches once classes have begun. The Security Guard has been instructed to ensure that this is done. Kindly comply with her instruction. Thank you.

Permission for Juniors (J3's and J4's only) to leave school on foot

- If you wish your J3 or J4 age child/children to leave school compound at 2:30 p.m. on foot to safely walk short distances nearby, a letter of request must be submitted to the Principal. The letter must state that you accept all liability for your child en-route to his/her destination. Please ensure that your child goes straight to his / her destination. This request must be made on an annual basis with updates where appropriate.
- The School accepts no liability for any child who leaves the School grounds without permission or once the child has left the compound on foot.
- **A TERM'S NOTICE IN WRITING** is required if your child is leaving St. Gabriel's to relocate abroad or to attend another school.

Additionally, when a child is removed from our register we are required to provide the name of the new school to the Ministry of Education, Science, Technology and Innovation and ask that this information is also given in your notification letter or as soon as it is available.

REFUNDABLE DEPOSITS

Parents who have Refundable Deposits and are withdrawing their children before they reach J4, must give ONE TERM'S NOTICE IN WRITING. The refund will be available <u>WITHIN six months</u> and the Office will contact you for collection. Thank you.

SCHOOL CLOSURE DIRECTIVES

We usually follow the directives given by the Ministry of Education and Human Resource Development that apply to the closure of schools. This will, of course, relate to weather conditions and other important matters or events. The announcements are usually made via the Radio and Television stations.

In the event that Ministry directives only apply to Government Schools, the Radio stations would be asked to make any special announcement on behalf of St. Gabriel's independently.

- **PERSONAL ITEMS:** PLEASE ensure that children have everything they need and that each item uniforms, shoes, lunchboxes, water bottles, equipment etc. **brought to school, is labelled with the name of the child**.
- Please check closets and return to the Office or directly to the owner, any equipment or items of clothing uniforms, t-shirts, shoes etc. which are <u>labelled with</u> <u>another child's name</u>, that your child may have mistakenly brought home. Thank you.
- **UNIFORMS**: it is important that every child wears the correct items of school uniform which should be maintained throughout the School Year: e.g. black shoes NOT BLACK SNEAKERS; boys **white shirt jacs** with crests, navy-blue shorts, ankle length navy-blue socks. Boxer shorts should not be visible. Girls <u>plain ankle length</u> white socks.

- Children must leave school wearing school uniform, including shoes not games or out-of-school activities clothes. It is a privilege as a member of the School to wear our uniform, and students should do so proudly and properly. This is an example of the "little things" which help to develop self-discipline and a school ethos.
- P. E. CLOTHES The School's regulation for P.E. lessons is that all children should be correctly dressed for P.E. as follows:
 - o <u>Infants</u> white St. Gabriel's T-shirt (also for Music & Movement)
 - O <u>Juniors</u> white or team coloured St. Gabriel's T-shirt, royal blue shorts (NOT uniform shorts) and white (majority) trainers / sneakers.
- **DRESS-UP DAYS** On a few occasions the students are given the opportunity to wear their own clothes or specified clothes and for this privilege there may be a charge.
- **HAIR** must be tied off the face when it reaches collar length and must not cover the eyes; white or dark blue hair ornaments are allowed. Styles (boys and girls) must not follow the latest trends (e.g. no dyes or mohawks), but be kept neat and appropriate.
- NAILS short, neat. No nail polish.
- **EARRINGS** for girls only. STUDS. No hoops or 'drop earrings permitted.
- OUTDOOR PLAY EQUIPMENT For their own safety, children are not allowed to play in the classrooms or on the play equipment before and after school. Please ensure your child has a reading or activity book in his/her bag.
- **HEALTHY DIETS** With increasing publicity about our dietary habits please give careful consideration to the content of lunchboxes...**NO** sweets, chocolate nor fizzy drinks please.

<u>Infants</u> – parents purchase lunch from the canteen and hand tickets to class Assistant. <u>Juniors</u> – J1 / J2 parents may purchase lunch – ensure child has lunch ticket in a safe place.

<u>J3 / J4</u> – children may purchase independently.

PEANUT BUTTER AND NUT PRODUCTS

Due to the number of food allergies among our students, St. Gabriel's has taken steps to increase awareness and to engage our School community in creating an environment sensitized to this issue. Among the most severe of all food allergens are <u>peanuts and peanut products</u>, which <u>can produce fatal reactions</u>. There are children with peanut allergies in the School (Infant and Junior departments).

We are appealing to you, as a parent of a child (children) in the School, to <u>avoid packing</u> <u>peanut butter sandwiches and other peanut snacks in your child's (children's) lunch <u>box</u>. Your assistance is vital because food sharing, though discouraged at St. Gabriel's, may still occur and EVEN PHYSICAL CONTACT WITH SOMEONE WHO HAS TOUCHED PEANUTS CAN CAUSE REACTIONS IN AN ALLERGIC CHILD.</u>

We appreciate your understanding and support as we seek to make St. Gabriel's a safer learning environment for all children.

• ABSOLUTELY NO SMOKING OR DRINKING ALCOHOL ON THE SCHOOL PREMISES.

 CITIZENSHIP AND STUDENT VISA DOCUMENTS for Non-National and Caricom children

If your child was born overseas and has Barbadian citizenship by descent, kindly submit a copy of his/her Citizenship by Descent Certificate to the Office as soon as possible if you have not already done so. Please note that your child may be considered a <u>non-Barbadian</u> student if the appropriate paperwork is not filed.

Student Visa forms can be collected from the Office as a matter of urgency.

AFTER SCHOOL SUPERVISION

✓ After School Supervision

When school closes at 12:00 noon on the first day or last day of term or any other shortened day, supervision lasts for one (1) hour – usually until 1:00 p.m. Please arrange collection accordingly.

- ✓ At 3:00 p.m. all remaining children are then supervised by Ms. Harris by the blue benches area. For the FIRST 15 minutes there is NO charge. Supervisory charges begin from 3:15 p.m. for students not taking part in after school activities. For children taking part in after school activities, a 10 minutes grace period is given at the end of the activity.
- ✓ PLEASE NOTE Where an activity begins at or after 3:00 p.m. the children must wait with the teachers who are on duty in the collection area or with an assigned teacher if this has been arranged. No children should be outside the Auditorium, on the hard court, the big field or in the Junior courtyard.
- ✓ From 3.16 p.m. onwards the fee is \$10.00 per child, per hour or part thereof until 5:00 p.m. The charge from 5:01 p.m. is \$20:00 per child, per hour or part thereof. If you wish to avoid these charges, kindly collect your child within the grace period which ends at 3:15 p.m. or make alternative arrangements for him/her to be collected before the time specified.
- Children must be signed out in the After-Care Book when collected from school after 3:15 p.m. Supervision after school is not free and therefore be advised that payment for supervision is \$10.00 per hour or part thereof.
- Parents, guardians and all persons collecting children from after-school care **must sign the child / children out** by writing their name and the correct pick-up time in the After Care book. Those who refuse to sign the book for reasons unknown, will still be charged and the amount will be added to your invoice if your child / ward remains under the supervisory care of Ms. Harris.
 - If you wish to avoid these charges, kindly collect your child within the grace period which ends at 3:15 p.m. or make alternative arrangements for him/her to be collected before the time specified.
- ✓ It can be rather disconcerting for a child to be the last to be picked up. This anxiety increases with time. Please, therefore endeavour to collect your child/children by 5.00 p.m. If you have been <u>unavoidably</u> delayed and cannot arrive before 5:00 p.m., please telephone the School (436-6078 or 426-6453 before 4:00 p.m.). Thank you.



Welcome back! The recycling programme at St. Gabriel's School which has one of the best recycling programmes in Barbados, has resumed. This term, parents are needed from each class to assist with sorting and storing recycling items. However, in order for the programme to continue efficiently, there must be dedicated parental support. All families – current and new - are encouraged to play their part in the recycling activity, which not only benefits the School but the entire environment.

If you have household items which can be recycled, please clean, separate and place them in their respective bins in the Recycling area (opposite the blue benches) or take them directly to the Recycling Shed at the bottom of the lower Car Park.

Please be mindful that fellow parents <u>volunteer</u> to keep the St. Gabriel's School's recycling programme in operation, and therefore should be treated with respect and consideration with the items they sort.



Recycling - St. Gabriel's School Recycling Programme (cont'd) **Important Recycling information**

- All recyclable items should be brought in clean and separated.
- WE DO NOT RECYCLE: general household garbage, Styrofoam containers, plastic bags, aerosol cans (Bop, Baygon etc.), tissues, toilet paper, dirty cardboard or paper, plastic containers as one package e.g. peanut containers, suit cases, irons, microwaves, light bulbs etc.
- Recyclable Items include: glass bottles, metal, plastic.
- Empty items in the individually marked bins; do not place entire bag in bin.
- Please do not bring general garbage to the Recycling areas!
- Remember. ALL items MUST BE CLEANED AND NO USED ITEMS SUCH AS GREASY CARDBOARD BOXES OR PLASTIC CONTAINERS (cake or pizza boxes, food containers, plastic cups or plates etc); USED TISSUES, UNWASHED CARTONS can be recycled. Items which are not separated are considered garbage.

Glass

- Any glass bottles whole, not broken, please!! Do not bring or leave broken glass in bins.
- All recyclable glass items should be empty and clean
- All colours can be placed together
- Remove the lids which can be placed in either metal or plastic recycling bins.

Metals

- Aluminium and metal can be placed together
- Do not place sharp edged lids with the metals

Plastics - Separated into 3 different categories

- 1. Clear soft drinks bottles: Coke, Frutee, Busta, Cran drink, etc. NO water Bottles.
- 2. Green soft drink bottles: Sprite, Ginger Ale, Mountain Dew
- 3. All other plastics, but make sure they have a recycle sign somewhere on it. Water bottles are "all other plastics" and should also carry the recycle sign.
- 4. Please ensure that **all plastic items** have the bottom). If not, they cannot be recycled.
- DO NOT PUT PLASTIC BAGS, SNACK WRAPPERS, BREAD BAGS etc. IN THE BINS. REUSE THE PLASTIC BAGS or dispose of them in the usual way.
- Do not leave anything outside the Recycling Centre shed, other than paper items which should be put in a bag.
- Please help lighten the load of a volunteer parent if they are carrying numerous items / bags to the Recycling shed. Taking one bag helps.
